RE: The food establishment located in Calgary, Alberta and municipally described as:
Second Cup 9921, 115-1919 Southland Drive SW

WHEREAS I, an **Executive Officer** of **Alberta Health Services**, have inspected the above noted premises pursuant to the provisions of the **Public Health Act**, RSA 2000, c. P-37, as amended;

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following conditions exist in and about the above noted premises which are or may become injurious or dangerous to the public health or which might hinder in any manner the prevention or suppression of disease, namely:

- a. The display cooler measured 15C and perishable product was stored inside.
- b. There were no chlorine test strips for their chlorine surface sanitizer.
- c. There was a build up of debris on the carpet in the front entrance, corners of floors in customer seating area and lower walls in the customer seating area.

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following breaches of the Public Health Act and the Food Regulation, Alberta Regulation 31/2006 and the Food Retail and Foodservices Code exist in and about the above noted premises, namely:

- a. The display cooler measured 15C and perishable product was stored inside. This is in contravention of the Food Regulation AR 31/2006 of section 25(1)(a)(b) which states that: All high-risk foods must be stored, displayed and transported at a temperature of not more

than 4°C or such higher temperature, or not less than 60°C or such lower temperature as an executive officer stipulates under subsection (4).

- b. There were no chlorine test strips for their chlorine surface sanitizer. This is in contravention of the Food Regulation AR 31/2006 section 28(1) & (2) which states: (1) A commercial food establishment must have all the facilities, equipment and utensils that are necessary to ensure its safe operation and maintenance. (2) A commercial food establishment, all equipment and utensils in it and all surfaces in it with which food comes into contact must be maintained in a sanitary condition and, without limiting the foregoing, must be washed and sanitized in a manner that removes contamination.
- c. There was a build up of debris on the carpet in the front entrance, corners of floors in customer seating area and lower walls in the customer seating area. This is in contravention of the Food Regulation AR 31/2006, section 28 (2), which states that: A commercial food establishment, all equipment and utensils in it and all surfaces in it with which food comes into contact must be maintained in a sanitary condition and, without limiting the foregoing, must be washed and sanitized in a manner that removes contamination.

NOW THEREFORE, I hereby **ORDER** and **DIRECT**:

1. That the Owner immediately undertake and diligently pursue the completion of the following work in and about the above noted premises, namely:
 - a. Repair display cooler.
 - b. Do not store perishable foods in the display cooler until it is repaired and maintained 4 degrees Celsius or lower.
 - c. Purchase chlorine test strips.
 - d. Clean the above noted areas.
2. The work referred to in paragraph 1 shall be completed by April 17, 2026

The above conditions were noted at the time of inspection and may not necessarily reflect all deficiencies. You are advised that further work may be required to ensure full compliance with the Public Health Act and regulations, or to prevent a public health nuisance.
