

ORDER OF AN EXECUTIVE OFFICER

RE: The food establishment located in Calgary, Alberta and municipally described as: Tokyo Station 1505 15 Avenue SW

WHEREAS I, an **Executive Officer** of **Alberta Health Services**, have inspected the above noted premises pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Act, RSA 2000, c. P-37, as amended;

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following conditions exist in and about the above noted premises which are or may become injurious or dangerous to the public health or which might hinder in any manner the prevention or suppression of disease, namely:

- a. There was significant mold growth on a large portion of the ceiling in the main floor washroom, the hallway ceiling from the washroom to the dining area, and the dining area ceiling beside the kitchen. Mold growth was also observed on the walls and door frame of the main floor washroom.
- b. The ventilation system in the kitchen was inadequate for the level of steam generated from the noodle boiling station. Mechanical ventilation was only installed above the grill and the fryer. There was no mechanical ventilation installed above the noodle boiling station. Significant steam was observed coming from the noodle boiling station. The steam travelled into the washroom and dining room areas.

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following breaches of the Public Health Act, the Nuisance and General Sanitation Regulation, Alberta Regulation 243/2003, and the Food Regulation, Alberta Regulation 31/2006 and the Food Retail and Foodservices Code exist in and about the above noted premises, namely:

- a. There was significant mold growth on a large portion of the ceiling in the main floor washroom, the hallway ceiling from the washroom to the dining area, and the dining area ceiling beside the kitchen. Mold growth was also observed on the walls and door frame of the main floor washroom. This is a contravention of section 2(1) of the Public Health Act Nuisance and General Sanitation Regulation, 2003 which states that: No person shall create, commit or maintain a nuisance.
- b. The ventilation system in the kitchen was inadequate for the level of steam generated from the noodle boiling station. Mechanical ventilation was only installed above the grill and the fryer. There was no mechanical ventilation installed above the noodle boiling station. Significant steam was observed coming from the noodle boiling station. The steam travelled into the washroom and dining room areas. This is in contravention of the Food Regulation AR 31/2006, section 17(1)(f)(iv), which states that: An operator must ensure that, before operation of the commercial food establishment commences, the commercial food establishment is equipped with a properly operating means of providing ventilation to food handling areas that are subject to the generation or accumulation of odours, fumes, steam, vapours, smoke or excessive heat.

NOW THEREFORE, I hereby ORDER and DIRECT:

- 1. That the Owner immediately undertake and diligently pursue the completion of the following work in and about the above noted premises, namely:
 - a. Remove all of the moldy drywall and all other building materials contaminated with mold.
 - b. Complete a destructive assessment to determine if water leakage/water infiltration is contributing to mold growth.
 - c. Repair all potential roof or plumbing deficiencies to stop water leakage/infiltration.
 - d. Clean and disinfect all opened areas. If the remedial work incorporates the kitchen, then the kitchen must close for the assessment and remediation period to prevent food contamination. All kitchen surfaces and equipment must be thoroughly cleaned and sanitized following remediation.
 - e. Retrofit the current ventilation system or install additional ventilation to effectively evacuate steam and vapors from the kitchen and reduce the moisture build-up.
 - f. Refinish the walls and ceiling wherever damaged materials are removed, such that all the walls and ceilings are smooth, impervious to moisture, and easily cleanable.
- 2. The work referred to in paragraph 1 shall be completed by **June 2nd, 2024**.

The above conditions were noted at the time of inspection and may not necessarily reflect all deficiencies. You are advised that further work may be required to ensure full compliance with the Public Health Act and regulations, or to prevent a public health nuisance.
