

## **ORDER OF AN EXECUTIVE OFFICER**

**To:** BKL Investments Ltd  
Pattison Food Group Ltd.  
John Olmsted  
“the Owners”

**RE:** The food establishment located in Westeros, Alberta and municipally described as:  
Village Market Westeros, 5 Village Drive

**WHEREAS** I, an **Executive Officer** of **Alberta Health Services**, have received a report about the above noted premises pursuant to the provisions of the **Public Health Act**, RSA 2000, c. P-37, as amended;

**AND WHEREAS** such report disclosed that the following conditions exist in and about the above noted premises which are or may become injurious or dangerous to the public health or which might hinder in any manner the prevention or suppression of disease, namely:

- a. The drinking water supply may be unsafe for human consumption as evidenced by the detection of Total Coliforms in a bacteriological sample collected on June 2, 2026 – (Total Coliforms – PRESENT), and the physical appearance that the water well casing may have been damaged, for this drinking water supply system.

**AND WHEREAS** such report disclosed that the following breaches of the Public Health Act and the Food Regulation, Alberta Regulation 31/2006 and the Food Retail and Foodservices Code and the Nuisance and General Sanitation Regulation, Alberta Regulation 243/2003 exist in and about the above noted premises, namely:

- a. The drinking water supply may be unsafe for human consumption as evidenced by the detection of Total Coliforms in a bacteriological sample collected on June 2, 2026 – (Total Coliforms – PRESENT), and the physical appearance that the water well casing may have been damaged, for this drinking water supply system, which is in contravention of the Nuisance and General Sanitation Regulation Section 11, which states “Where a person provided a source of water that the person intends to be used or realizes or ought to realize will be used by the public for human consumption, the person shall ensure that the water is potable.”

NOW THEREFORE, I hereby **ORDER** and **DIRECT**:

1. That the Owner immediately undertake and diligently pursue the completion of the following work in and about the above noted premises, namely:
  - a. Remove and discard any food items that would have been processed with this water since June 2, 2026.
  - b. Diligently pursue with the owner of the water well serving your facility, the repairs that are necessary by a qualified professional.

- c. Ensure that once repairs are completed, that the water well and distribution system are disinfected.
- d. Operate the food premises under boil water advisory conditions.
- e. Submit 2 water well samples, for bacteriological purposes, 24 hours apart and have Satisfactory results.

2. The work referred to in paragraph 1 shall be completed by June 12, 2026.

The above conditions were noted at the time of receipt of the report and may not necessarily reflect all deficiencies. You are advised that further work may be required to ensure full compliance with the Public Health Act and regulations, or to prevent a public health nuisance.
