

## ORDER OF AN EXECUTIVE OFFICER

**To:** Samson Abay  
"the Owner"

**RE:** The food establishment located in Edmonton, Alberta and municipally described as:  
Campus Restaurant & Bar, 10406 – 118 Avenue

**WHEREAS** I, an **Executive Officer** of **Alberta Health Services**, have inspected the above noted premises pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Act, RSA 2000, c. P-37, as amended;

**AND WHEREAS** such inspection disclosed that the following conditions exist in and about the above noted premises which are or may become injurious or dangerous to the public health or which might hinder in any manner the prevention or suppression of disease, namely:

- a. The commercial dishwasher was non-functional. Insufficient facilities were present to properly wash, rinse, and sanitize reusable utensils, food service, and food preparation items.
- b. Written sanitation procedures were not in use, sufficient, or available.

**AND WHEREAS** such inspection disclosed that the following breaches of the Public Health Act and the Food Regulation, Alberta Regulation 31/2006 and the Food Retail and Foodservices Code exist in and about the above noted premises, namely:

- a. Violations [a, b] are in contravention of section 28 of the Food Regulation, which states "(1) A commercial food establishment must have all the facilities, equipment and utensils that are necessary to ensure its safe operation and maintenance. (2) A commercial food establishment, all equipment and utensils in it and all surfaces in it with which food comes into contact must be maintained in a sanitary condition and, without limiting the foregoing, must be washed and sanitized in a manner that removes contamination. (3) All equipment and utensils in a commercial food establishment must be (a) kept in good working order and condition, and (b) maintained in a manner that ensures the safe and sanitary handling of food."
- b. Violation [c] is in contravention of section 29 of the Food Regulation states, "A commercial food establishment must have written procedures designed to ensure its safe and sanitary operation and maintenance" and "The procedures must include (a) the cleaning and sanitizing requirements for the food establishment and for all equipment and utensils in it, if any, that are not normally washed in a dishwasher, and (b) a list of all cleaning and sanitizing agents used in the food establishment, including their concentrations and uses."

NOW THEREFORE, I hereby **ORDER** and **DIRECT**:

1. That the Owner immediately undertake and diligently pursue the completion of the following work in and about the above noted premises, namely:

- a. Discontinue the use of multi-use service items such as plates, cups, and utensils. You must only use single use service items and utensils for customer food until such time as the dishwasher has been repaired, and written permission is given to change back to multi-use by an Executive Officer of Alberta Health Services.
  - b. Clean all and sanitize all areas of the facility that were noted to be unsanitary during the inspection conducted on November 16, 2018, and any other areas noted during the subsequent re-inspection on November 19, 2018.
  - c. Develop, implement, and follow a written cleaning and sanitation plan to ensure that the facility is maintained in a clean and sanitary condition at all times.
2. The work referred to in paragraph 1 shall be completed according to the following schedule:
- Item a must be complied with immediately.
  - Item b must be completed before opening for business on November 23, 2018.
  - Item c must be completed before opening for business on December 7, 2018.

The above conditions were noted at the time of inspection and may not necessarily reflect all deficiencies. You are advised that further work may be required to ensure full compliance with the Public Health Act and regulations, or to prevent a public health nuisance.
