

ORDER OF AN EXECUTIVE OFFICER

RE: Those premises located in Calgary, Alberta and municipally described as:
Southside Victory Church Fellowship
6402 1A Street SW

WHEREAS I, an **Executive Officer of Alberta Health Services**, have inspected the above noted premises pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Act, RSA 2000, c. P-37, as amended;

AND WHEREAS the Chief Medical Officer of Health (CMOH) has issued the Records Of Decision – CMOH Order 25-2020, 26-2020, 40-2020, and 41-2020 of the Public Health Act, in response to a public health emergency,

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following conditions exist in and about the above noted premises in contravention of the above order of the CMOH and which are or may become injurious or dangerous to the public health or which might hinder in any manner the prevention or suppression of disease, namely:

- a. Most of the church attendees were unmasked.
- b. The pastor and all of the church staff/volunteers observed were unmasked.
- c. An individual, who appeared to be a senior citizen, was greeting people at the door, handing out documents, and was observed hugging people and making direct contact with members of the public. This individual was not masked.
- d. There were church attendees that were socializing in the lobby and auditorium. These attendees were making direct contact with members of other households while not masked or distanced at least 2 meters.
- e. In the auditorium, members of different households were not distanced at least 2 meters apart. The front rows in the auditorium were full, with people sitting side by side and with the rows of seats themselves not distanced 2 meters from each other.
- f. There was a stage with a group performance occurring. Performers were not masked nor were they distanced at least 2 meters from each other.
- g. The pastor was asked about the attendance at the service and was unable to provide an accurate number with how many people were present in the building, and stated he did not know the maximum capacity currently allowed as per CMOH Order 40-2020. There did not appear to be anyone on site counting or overseeing the numbers of attendees coming into the building and therefore, maximum capacity may have been exceeded. Calgary Police Services were on site and counted approximately 180 – 200 people leaving the building at approximately 1:00 pm.

- h. There was no COVID-19 related signage posted to instruct those who may have been exposed to COVID-19 not to enter.

NOW THEREFORE, I hereby **ORDER** and **DIRECT**:

1. That the Owner immediately undertake and diligently pursue the completion of the following work in and about the above noted premises, namely:
 - a. Ensure that all staff, volunteers, and performers are masked at all times.
 - b. Ensure that all attendees are masked at all times.
 - c. Do not hand out or share items that cannot be cleaned and sanitized before and after each use (for example: books, hymns, and programs).
 - d. Calculate the total operational load based on the current Chief Medical Officer of Health's Orders.
 - e. Do not allow the building capacity to exceed the number calculated in 1d.
 - f. Ensure that physical distancing (2m) between households is strictly enforced at all times in the building.
 - g. Ensure that performers are spaced apart to allow for physical distancing (2 meters).
 - h. Post COVID-19 related signage to instruct those who may have been exposed to COVID-19 not to enter.
 - i. Complete the Relaunch Plan Template, located in the Government of Alberta General Relaunch Guidance document. Provide details of all risk mitigation measures to be implemented to prevent the transmission of COVID-19. This document must include all activities that take place in the church facility, including meetings and other gatherings. The Relaunch Template must be submitted to an Alberta Health Services Executive Officer for review.
2. The work referred to in paragraph 1 shall be completed before December 13, 2020.

The above conditions were noted at the time of inspection and may not necessarily reflect all deficiencies. You are advised that further work may be required to ensure full compliance with the Public Health Act and regulations, or to prevent a public health nuisance.
