

**ORDER OF AN EXECUTIVE OFFICER
UNFIT FOR HUMAN HABITATION
ORDER TO VACATE**

To: 1707588 AB Ltd.

And To: All Occupants of the following Housing premises:

RE: Those housing premises located in Lethbridge, Alberta and municipally described as:
528 13 Street S.

WHEREAS I, an **Executive Officer** of **Alberta Health Services**, have inspected the above noted premises pursuant to the provisions of the **Public Health Act**, RSA 2000, c. P-37, as amended;

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following conditions exist in and about the above noted premises which are or may become injurious or dangerous to the public health or which might hinder in any manner the prevention or suppression of disease, namely:

- a. There are numerous broken windows.
- b. There are broken electrical fixtures throughout the home.
- c. The plumbing fixtures appear to be in very poor condition.
- d. Extensive finishing issues throughout the home. This includes, but is not limited to: holes in walls, holes in doors, missing portions of ceiling and severely damaged flooring.
- e. There are no working smoke detectors.
- f. There are no useable kitchen appliances.
- g. The foundation appears to be in poor condition.

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following breaches of the Public Health Act and the the Nuisance and General Sanitation Regulation AR243/2003 exist in and about the above noted premises, namely:

- a. There are numerous broken windows which is in contravention of Section 2(1) and Section 2(2)(a) of the Nuisance and General Sanitation Regulation AR243/2003 which reads: *"No person shall create, commit or maintain a nuisance"*.
- b. There are broken electrical fixtures throughout the home which is in contravention of Section 2(1) and Section 2(2)(a) of the Nuisance and General Sanitation Regulation AR243/2003 which reads: *"No person shall create, commit or maintain a nuisance"*.
- c. The plumbing fixtures appear to be in very poor condition which is in contravention of Section 2(1) and Section 2(2)(a) of the Nuisance and General Sanitation Regulation AR243/2003 which reads: *"No person shall create, commit or maintain a nuisance"*.

AND WHEREAS, by virtue of the foregoing, the above noted premises are hereby declared to be **Unfit for Human Habitation**.

NOW THEREFORE, I hereby **ORDER** and **DIRECT**:

- 1. That the occupants vacate the above noted premises on or before June 28, 2021.
- 2. That the Owner immediately undertake and diligently pursue the completion of the following work in and about the above noted premises, namely:
 - a. Address the above issues to the satisfaction of an Environmental Public Health Officer or, alternatively, demolish the home.
- 3. That until such time as the work referred to above is completed to the satisfaction of an Executive Officer of Alberta Health Services; the above noted premises shall remain vacant and secure from unauthorized entry.

The above conditions were noted at the time of inspection and may not necessarily reflect all deficiencies. You are advised that further work may be required to ensure full compliance with the Public Health Act and regulations, or to prevent a public health nuisance.
