KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

Since their inception in 2009, Advisory Council members have shared advice and feedback from their communities with Alberta Health Services (AHS). They've held public meetings and engagement activities virtually or in locations throughout their geographic area that further contributed to improving healthcare services in Alberta.

During the last year, David Thompson Health Advisory Council (DTHAC) partnered with Provincial Population and Public Health to learn about routine vaccines for infants, school-aged children and adults. Council shared learnings with their networks to spread the word about the importance of maintaining a healthy lifestyle.

Recognizing the significance of senior's health and continuing care services, particularly among an aging population, the DTHAC, alongside the Yellowhead East Health Advisory Council (YEHAC), hosted an event featuring AHS and community experts. The session addressed topics such as:

- Seniors and continuing care programs;
- The long-term care placement process;
- Fall prevention;
- The Seniors and Continuing Care Provincial Health Advisory Council (SCC PAC);
- Dementia Friendly Communities; and,
- Healthy aging initiatives.

In 2024, Council focused on increasing awareness of mental wellness resources and initiatives. The first meeting of the year addressed access to mental health promotion workshops and easy-to-implement stress management techniques.

DTHAC wrapped its meetings with an event on mental health literacy. This event underscored the importance of equipping youth and families with the resources to make informed decisions about the services they access. It delved into evidence-based practices aimed at enhancing mental health outcomes and explored avenues for accessing these resources within their respective communities.

Hot topics of discussion included:

- Workforce recruitment (shortages).
- Temporary service disruptions with specialized services i.e., labour and delivery.
- Emergency department closures.
