Seniors and Continuing Care	 Council has identified that Seniors and Continuing Care (SCC) services as a priority in our Council area. Council commits to: Partner with AHS Seniors & Continuing Care (SCC)/home care/other local groups. Present on senior's safety at home, fall prevention, etc. Increase knowledge about paramedicine programs available within the Council area. Increase knowledge about the referral process to access paramedicine programs available within the Council area. Work with SCC partners to hear what new initiatives are being developed/implemented to enhance the quality of care and care for seniors. Learn more about seniors housing, affordability, and continuity of care. Explore evidence-based information regarding the appropriate use of anti-psychotics within Albertan senior's care centres. 	ongoing basis
Racial and cultural minority access to health services.	 Council believes, based on engagement in 2019-20 that racially and culturally diverse people often have unequal access to healthcare services, often based on language barriers. Council commits to: Further explore this belief by collaborating with targeted community groups to learn more about perceived barriers to health care services (i.e., inner city community groups, and multicultural health care brokers' community groups) and to share those learnings with Zone leadership. Where barriers are identified, collaborate with community to identify possible solutions to improve access to mental health resources available within the Council area. Through this work, Council will enhance the knowledge and understanding of challenges faced by some Albertans and share that understanding with AHS Zone leadership with a goal to support improvement. Build awareness among Council membership of any programs or services available specifically for diverse populations within the Council area. 	ongoing basis
