

#### **KEY ACHIEVMENTS**

Since their inception in 2009, Advisory Council members have share advice and feedback from their communities with Alberta Health Services (AHS). They've held public meetings and engagement activities virtually or in locations throughout their geographic area that further contributed to improving healthcare services in Alberta.

Lakeland Communities Health Advisory Council (LCHAC) held two regular public meetings and one in camera meeting through the year. Presentation topics included EMS updates, AHS new Alberta Virtual Chronic Pain Program (AVCPP), workforce updates from AHS' Talent Acquisition team, and much more.

The Council hosted a virtual engagement event where they heard from local AHS Public Health, Allied Health and Mental Health teams about shared health supports for children under the age of five, including:

- Health supports for preschool children.
- Childhood immunizations.
- Preventive care.
- Pre-natal care services.

Council attended a session with the Health Minister in November to learn about plans to refocus the health system, and subsequent changes to AHS and Health Advisory Councils. In March, Council met in Athabasca with MLA Martin Long, Parliamentary Secretary for Rural Health, and staff from Alberta Health, to discuss successes and opportunities for improvement as government prepared to launch its new Regional Advisory Councils (RACs).

Council was invited to attend the Raising of the Tipi ceremony at the William J. Cadzow-Lac La Biche Healthcare Centre in May. The Chair and Vice Chair also had the opportunity to attend the grand reopening of the renovated and upgraded Medical Device Reprocessing Area (MDRA) at the William J. Cadzow-Lac La Biche Healthcare Centre in May.

Topics of discussion throughout the year included:

- Physician recruitment.
- Healthcare worker appreciation.
- Hospital department closures (staffing shortages).
- Connect Care launch.
- Access to seniors care in the region.
- Rural mental health services.
