### Key achievements of 2020-21

Work over the last year focused primarily on enhancing interactions with local communities and bringing forward the public's feedback to AHS.



#### Community concerns shared with Zone leadership included:

- Access to addictions and mental health supports
- Medicine Hat and Brooks Family Maternity Clinic
- Vulnerable populations and seniors impacted by the pandemic
- Outsourcing of community lab collection and linen/laundry services
- Medical Assistance in Dying (MAID) procedures and policies
- COVID-19 vaccine rollout and supply



#### Council engaged with AHS on the following topics:

- COVID-19 and vaccine rollout
- Emergency Medical Services (EMS) listening sessions
- Facility-based continuing care
- Influenza campaign
- Unconscious bias
- Cardiac service planning



#### **Public Participation:**

- 53 community members attended regular HAC meetings
- 197 community members attended community engagement events



Council continued building its relationship with AHS via strategic planning meetings among our Chair, Vice Chair, South Zone leadership, and Advisory Council Coordinator. These touchpoints ensured consistent and open communication and resulted in the PTHAC Chair participating in the interview and selection committee for the new South Zone Chief Zone Officer.



There was a significant increase in death by suicide, particularly among males located in or connected to the Medicine Hat area. One of our Council members participated in collaborative community meetings with Medicine Hat stakeholders to discuss strategy, community response, and ongoing planning.



Council continued building its relationship with AHS Provincial Advisory Councils (PAC) by inviting Seniors and Continuing Care PAC members share insights on the PAC role and where opportunities for further collaboration exist.

## A look ahead

A refreshed model we named HAC 2.0 was implemented in 2020 and has improved the way HACs interact with the public, including incorporating community engagement events in our annual planning calendar. HAC 2.0 was implemented amid the reality and constraints of the COVID-19 pandemic resulting in all engagement events being held virtually until it is safe to proceed in-person.

Council remains focused on informing community stakeholders, hosting community engagement events, and building new partnerships. We are committed to four key areas:

- Addiction and mental health: Council will support AHS zone leadership by sharing information and resources on addiction and mental health services available. within their community.
- Seniors health and continuing care: Council will participate in local service planning, promoting seniors health priorities and ensuring zone leadership is aware of seniors health and continuing care concerns in the zone.
- Rural health: Council will partner with Rural Health Professions Action Plan (RhPAP) and Primary Care Networks (PCN) to promote local resources, retention and recruitment of health professionals in the area.
- Communication: Council will advise AHS on the readability of its public resource materials and provide input on improving online navigation. We will also share information back with our communities to bring awareness of AHS channels of communication.

PTHAC will continue to value and grow current and new partnerships in health. Relationships with partners such as RhPAP, PCNs, and local health foundations are invaluable.

We greatly appreciate the perspective our HAC members bring to the table on behalf of our communities. Their experiences help us to respond to questions, issues, and challenges they see and feel, while their input assists us in finding creative and innovative solutions to address shape the priorities within the communities they represent. The HAC's are extremely valuable to the healthcare system.
