Where we are

The Prairie Mountain Health Advisory Council area stretches from Didsbury in the north to Lake Louise in the west and continues eastward to towns such as Lomond and Hussar, and southward to Claresholm. Communities in the area include Calgary, Okotoks, Vulcan, Canmore, Airdrie, High River and Gleichen. Our Council area is within the traditional meeting place of the Blackfoot people and the people of the Treaty 7 region in Southern Alberta, which includes the Siksika, the Tsuut'ina and the Stoney Nakoda First Nations. The City of Calgary is also home to Inuit and Métis Nation of Alberta, Region 3 (see map page 2).

Our role and objectives


Everything we do is about improving the health and wellness of Albertans, no matter what part of the province they live in. We:
