KEY ACHIEMENTS

Since their inception in 2009, Advisory Council members have share advice and feedback from their communities with Alberta Health Services (AHS). They've held public meetings and engagement activities virtually or in locations throughout their geographic area that further contributed to improving healthcare services in Alberta.

Wood Buffalo Health Advisory Council (WBHAC) held three public meetings during the year. Presentation topics included an overview of the Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity and Expression (SOGIE) Provincial Advisory Council (PAC), AHS' new Alberta Virtual Chronic Pain Program (AVCPP), and a workforce update from AHS' Talent Acquisition team.

The Council hosted a virtual engagement event focused on addiction and mental health services available in the Wood Buffalo region. Participants heard from local AHS Addiction and Mental Health teams and 12 different community service agencies as they shared addiction and mental health services available in the region. 36 people participated in this community conversation.

Council attended a session with the Health Minister in November to learn about plans to refocus the health system, and subsequent changes to AHS and Health Advisory Councils. In March, Council met in Fort McMurray with MLA Martin Long, Parliamentary Secretary for Rural Health, and staff from Alberta Health, to discuss successes and opportunities for improvement as government prepared to launch its new Regional Advisory Councils (RAC).

Topics of discussion throughout the year included:

- Workforce recruitment (shortages).
- Addiction and Mental Health services.
- Supporting the LGBTQS+ community.
- Limited seniors care in the region.
- Supports for Indigenous community members.
- Access to services in the region.

- 78 public attended meetings and events through the year.
- 4 meetings and events between July 1, 2023-June 30, 2024.
- 4 new members recruited.
