Key Message

- Effective July 19, 2024, serum beta hCG testing performed on the Abbott i-STAT device will not be available due to unavailable supply by the manufacturer.
 - Alberta Precision Laboratories is working with the manufacturer to determine when supply will be available in Canada and onsite testing can resume.
 - See Appendix 1 for impacted sites with i-STAT as primary device for serum beta hCG

How this will impact you

- If your site currently orders serum beta hCG (LAB5192) for i-STAT testing (query ectopic pregnancy in the Emergency Department), testing will be sent to a referral site on an interim basis.
 - Please order beta hCG, Quantitative (LAB143)
 - <u>Stat</u> designation required if testing for ectopic pregnancy investigation, otherwise sample will be sent to designated hub laboratory.
 - Beta hCG, Quantitative iSTAT (LAB5192) will not be available to order effective July 19, 2024
- Be aware of the change in methodology order priority (routine vs. stat), and that there will be a delay in result reporting.
 - Urine hCG testing remains available for ordering if clinically indicated

Action Required

- Be aware of the serum beta hCG i-STAT test changes and ensure that the appropriate test <u>and</u> priority are ordered.
- If the local laboratory normally tests serum beta hCG with an i-STAT device, then they will support referred out testing to the closest appropriate site.
