Key Message

 A new test is now available in Epic for clinicians to request a pathologist consult, called Request for Additional Testing Pathology.

Background

Previous requests for a pathologist consultation from clinicians came via email, fax, phone calls, etc. to a
specific pathologist. If that pathologist was away there was no method of ensuring that these requests were
handled in a timely manner. Pathology has received many requests from clinicians to have a method via
Epic to request a consultation, and this test provides that pathway. Community clinicians who do not have
access to Epic will continue to use prior methods for consult requests such as fax.

How this will impact you

The process is streamlined for both clinicians and pathologists. Clinicians will be able to submit specific
questions regarding surgical pathology, non-gyne cytology, gyne cytology, or autopsy cases using this new
workflow. Pathologists will now follow a new process in Epic to approve or deny these requests.

Action Required

 Clinicians can order Request for Additional Testing Pathology in Epic to have specific questions reviewed and answered.
