• Effective June 17, 2025, Conjugated Bilirubin testing will be implemented at Athabasca, Cold Lake, Edson, Hinton, Lac la Biche, Slave Lake, St Paul, Wabasca, and Westlock Laboratories. Currently this testing is referred to Edmonton Base Lab.

• This is a change to accommodate ongoing provincial test menu standardization across rural acute care facility laboratories in Alberta.
