RE:	Blood Availability at Trauma Team Activation

PLEASE POST OR DISTRIBUTE AS WIDELY AS APPROPRIATE

Key Message

- Effective January 16, 2023, the Medical Laboratory Assistants responding to a Trauma Team Activation (TTA) will deliver a blood box containing 2 units unmatched group O red cells (RBCs).
- This blood box is **only** to be opened if emergency transfusion is required.
- The blood box **must** be returned to the laboratory as soon as it is determined that emergency transfusion is **not** required.

Background

- This is being done in response to concerns about the inability to rapidly access red cells and to decrease the over activation of MHPs.
- This process will be continually monitored and is subject for Quality Assurrance review of impact and inappropriate utilization.

How this will impact you

- Unmatched RBCs will be available in the trauma bay if emergency transfusion is required.
- Additional RBC units will still need to be picked up by a designated runner at the laboratory.

Action Required

- The blood box is only to be opened if emergency transfusion is required.
- If it is determined that emergency transfusion is not required, the blood box must be returned to the laboratory as soon as possible.
