# PLEASE POST OR DISTRIBUTE AS WIDELY AS APPROPRIATE

## **Key Message**

• Effective **March 27, 2024** the Fort Vermilion laboratory will be implementing a new chemistry analyzer (Vitros XT3400) to replace the current aging Siemens Dimension EXL analyzer.

## **Background**

- The Vitros XT3400 is the platform currently being used by rural hospitals across Alberta.
- On December 5<sup>th</sup>, 2022 the Fort Vermilion laboratory became a part of Alberta Precision Labs and has been in the process of transitioning to standardized provincial testing platforms.
- Testing for serum hCG, Troponin, and BNP will remain on the existing instrument (Siemens Dimension EXL) until the new platform (Beckman Access 2) is live.
- Available test menu is unchanged. Lactate will no longer be performed on the iStat but will now be performed on the XT3400.
- Preferred sample types and reference intervals remain unchanged except for calcium, see below.
- New calcium reference interval

	Current Reference Interval on the	New Reference Interval on the
Age	Siemens Dimension	Vitros XT3400
0 up to 11 days	1.80 – 2.70 mmol/L	1.80 – 2.90 mmol/L
11 days up to 1 year	2.20 – 2.70 mmol/L	2.20 – 2.80 mmol/L
>1 year	2.05 – 2.45 mmol/L	2.10 – 2.60 mmol/L

• There will no longer be a critical value for conjugated bilirubin in any age group. On the current platform, conjugated bilirubin >18 umol/L is considered critical for neonates 0-1 month of age.

## How this will impact you

- Please be aware of changes to calcium reference intervals.
- Significantly elevated conjugated bilirubin in neonates will no longer be phoned to the ordering physician/department.
- No other significant impact is expected.
