Re: Decommissioning Blood Storage Refrigerator at SHC OR

PLEASE POST OR DISTRIBUTE AS WIDELY AS APPROPRIATE

Key Message:

Effective November 23, 2020, the blood storage refrigerator at SHC OR will be decommissioned.

Background:

- This change is being implemented in response to a Health Canada citation for failing to adequately track and monitor blood products and components in and out of satellite refrigerators.
- Current blood storage refrigerators external to TM departments are being eliminated due to these Health Canada requirements.

Action Required:

- For Surgeons and/or Anesthesiologists:
 - o Order Type and Screen and red blood cells (RBCs), as per usual practice.
 - o RBCs will be prepared and stored in TM refrigerator until requested.
- For Nursing staff:
 - Pre-operatively in SCM, dispense On Standby RBCs or order OR Only RBCs, as per usual practice.
 - o In SCM, under "Additional Information to TM" when dispensing, indicate "PACU" or "OR".
 - When the need for transfusion arises, call TM (6-1344). RBCs will be sent immediately via the pneumatic tube system (PTS). Up to 2 RBC units can be sent via each PTS carrier.
 - Retrieve RBCs from PTS carrier.
 - o On average, delivery should occur within 3-5 minutes.

Additional Information:

- For cases requiring multiple blood products/components or deemed to be high risk, blood products/ components can be sent to OR and stored in TM-validated blood boxes.
 - Call TM to request a transport box or indicate this need in "Additional Information to TM" when dispensing.
 - o Boxes will be sealed and are not to be opened until the blood will be transfused.
- Any unused products must be returned to TM via portering, not PTS.
