RE:	Discontinuation of Plastic Bag Use for Transport of Blood Components and Products

Key Message

• Effective **April 1**, **2021**, Transfusion Medicine will discontinue the routine use of plastic bags for transport of blood components and products within Calgary hospital sites.

Background:

• This change is being implemented to align with the Government of Canada's plan (1,2) use plastic items.

How this will impact you:

- Blood components and products will be transported without plastic bags.
- In limited circumstances, Transfusion Medicine will place the items in paper bags or transport boxes. Paper bags are single-use only as they cannot be disinfected.
