Re: Discontinuation of Thrombin Time Testing

PLEASE POST OR DISTRIBUTE AS WIDELY AS APPROPRIATE

Key Message:

- Effective December 14, 2020 Chinook Regional Hospital and Medicine Hat Regional Hospital Laboratories will discontinue on site Thrombin Time Testing.
- Thrombin Time Testing will be referred off site to Calgary and results will be available in Netcare.
- Current SZ Thrombin Time Testing volumes are very low (<10 requests per year) and it is no longer
 justifiable to continue on-site testing.
- There is no longer a clinical indication for Thrombin Time testing in emergency situations.

Why this is important:

- It is recognized that Thrombin Time Testing is not an effective indicator of Direct Oral Anticoagulant (DOAC) effectiveness.
- Idarucizumab (Praxbind) is an antidote now available for the reversal of dabigatran (pradaxa) which is
 indicated in the setting of severe life threatening bleeding or high risk emergent/urgent procedures in
 patients with suspected or proven dabigatran (pradaxa) related coagulopathy.
- Idarucizumab (Praxbind) is readily available through Pharmacy at Chinook Regional Hospital and Medicine Hat Regional Hospital.

Background

- APL continues to review testing practices with the goal of optimizing test utilization and cost effectiveness.
- APL Hematology Discipline Council has approved sites discontinuing testing based on testing volumes
 10 test requests per year.
- Calgary Hematology Pathologist Dr. Meer-Taher Shabani-Rad was consulted and approves this change.
