# PLEASE POST OR DISTRIBUTE AS WIDELY AS APPROPRIATE

#### Key Message

- Effective May 13, 2024, lactate will be included as part of venous/arterial blood gas panels at certain rural acute care facilities.
- Lactate can still be ordered singly when required.

#### Background

- To align with provincially standardized reporting for blood gas panels, North Zone will start reporting all parameters tested. Currently, some sites carry a cartridge that includes lactate. This will now be reported on every patient regardless of whether a lactate was ordered specifically.
- All rural facilities in North Zone currently use the iSTAT for their blood gas testing, however, only certain sites carry the cartridge which includes lactate.
- Sites that do not offer lactate on their blood gas panels have it available on site on their mainframe chemistry platform (Vitros XT3400).
- This change does NOT apply to regional facilities where blood gases are managed by respiratory technologists (Grande Prairie and Northern Lights Regional Hospitals).

#### How this will impact you

• Some facilities will start reporting lactate routinely as part of their blood gas panel.

### Action Required

- Please see the table above and be aware of reporting changes.
- Continue to order lactate specifically when required.
- Prolonged application of tourniquet for more than 1 minute may falsely increase lactate. Ensure appropriate collection techniques are followed. Refer to <u>Standardization of Tourniquet use for Collection</u> of lonized Calcium and Lactate (albertahealthservices.ca)
