Key Message

• **Effective immediately**, the Infliximab Antibodies test offered by the University of Alberta Hospital, Special Chemistry Lab in Edmonton will temporarily be referred out to St Paul's Hospital Lab in BC.

Background

• Due to technical challenges, the University of Alberta Hospital, Special Chemistry Laboratory is unable to run and report the Infliximab Antibodies test until further notice.

How this will impact you

- Blood collected into a **serum** gold or a red top tube is the acceptable sample type. The referral lab DOES NOT ACCEPT plasma lavender EDTA tubes. The minimum blood collection volume is 4mL.
- The Special Chemistry Laboratory in Edmonton will continue to run and report Infliximab Level.
- For subtherapeutic drug concentrations (Infliximab Level <3.0ug/mL), a comment will append: "Infliximab antibodies test referred out. Report to follow."
- Reflex testing for total antibodies to infliximab will be measured by a different ELISA kit at St Paul's Hospital Laboratory (see report change below).

Antibodies to Infliximab	Interpretation
Not Detected	Antibodies to infliximab not detected.
1+	Antibodies to infliximab detected, clinical significance uncertain.
2+ or 3+	Antibodies to infliximab detected at significant concentrations.

- Infliximab antibodies are run every second week on Thursday. Expect delays in turnaround time
- Referral lab reports will be scanned into Epic Beaker but will not appear in Netcare. Physicians that are not in Connect Care will receive a paper copy of the report in the mail.

Action Required

- A <u>complete</u> APL Infliximab Level Order Form signed by a specialist MUST be sent with the specimen. Incomplete forms may result in testing delays.
