KE.	Launch of molecular Vaginitis Screen & Updates to Trichomonas vaginalis testing (only applicable to locations sending testing to <i>Dyna</i> LIFE Edmonton)

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Key Message

- Effective October 17, 2023, DynaLIFE's Edmonton Laboratory will replace microscopy for bacterial vaginosis/yeast with the Vaginitis Screen, a nucleic acid amplification test (NAAT) panel comprised of 3 diagnostic targets [bacterial vaginosis (BV), vulvovaginal candidiasis (CV), and Trichomonas vaginalis (TV)]
- The Aptima[®] Multitest Swab must now be used to collect a vaginal swab for the Vaginitis Screen.
- When the Vaginitis Screen is ordered all three components (BV/CV/TV) will be tested and reported.
- After December 12, 2023, ESwabs will NO LONGER be accepted for BV/Yeast testing.
- Continue to use ESwabs for genital culture and yeast culture requests. Note that requests for these
 cultures, as before, require appropriate clinical history included with the order. Refer to the *DynaLIFE*test directory for further details.
- The Vaginitis Screen is only appropriate for patients **14 years of age and older.** For younger patients, please submit an ESwab for genital culture, as above.
- To simplify sample collection, if both the Vaginitis Screen and Chlamydia/Gonorrhea Screen (CT/GC Screen) are ordered, please collect and send ONE vaginal Aptima® Multitest Swab.
- Testing for *Trichomonas vaginalis* in children and male adults on urine (female, male, children) or on Aptima[®] swabs (female adult, female child) is now accepted for the Aptima *Trichomonas vaginalis* Assay. Please direct your patient to a Patient Service Centre for collection and testing.

How this will impact you

- The Vaginitis Screen will provide a diagnosis for the most common agents of vaginitis from a single vaginal swab (Aptima® Multitest Swab).
- We expect a significant improvement in turn-around time for the diagnosis of BV/yeast/Trichomonas.
- Testing for *Trichomonas vaginalis* may still be ordered separately and will be performed from Aptima[®] swabs (female adult, female child) or urine (female, male, children), alone or in combination with CT/NG Screen requests for all patients.



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Action Required

- Community providers in the Edmonton, Central, and North Zones:
 - Order the Vaginitis Screen using the interim Molecular Genitourinary & STI Requisition (downloadable through the *DynaLIFE.ca*/Requisitions webpage). Note that the CT/NG Screen may be ordered on this requisition as well.
- Care providers in other Zones (including Grande Prairie Regional Hospital, Northern Lights Regional Health Centre and Red Deer Regional Hospital Centre):
 - No changes to the current process.
- Connect Care sites:
 - Order the test using the Vaginitis Screen orderable in Connect Care.
- Collect vaginal swab specimens using the Aptima® Multitest Swab:
 - Swabs can be ordered through the existing lab supply ordering process.
- For patients <14 years of age:
 - The Vaginitis Screen is not recommended and will not be performed. For these patients, order a genital culture and submit an ESwab specimen. *Trichomonas vaginalis* testing for this age group may be ordered as a stand-alone test using Aptima[®] swabs (female adult, female child)/urine (female, male, children).

^{*}If both Vaginitis Screen and CT/NG screening required for adult females, collecting ONE vaginal swab using Aptima Multitest Swab will suffice.
†If only CT/NG and TV screening are required, collect one specimen using the appropriate Aptima collection device for that patient.

^{*} For Edmonton locations, refer patients to the Patient Service Centers (PSC) for collection.
