Key Message

- Effective July 6, 2021, ASO will no longer be measured at Red Deer Regional Hospital Centre lab and will be referred to DynaLIFE Medical Labs in Edmonton <u>except</u> specimens from Drumheller, Hanna and Three Hills Health Centers will be referred to the Diagnostic Scientific Centre in Calgary.
- Anticipated turnaround time is 24-48 hours depending on time of collection.
- Results will be available in Netcare and Physician Office Systems (POS).

Why this is Important

- ASO measures antibodies to *Streptococcus pyogenes* (group A streptococci), with higher levels indicating more recent exposure.
- This test detects antecedent group A streptococcal infection and may be used in the diagnosis and follow-up of suspected cases of acute rheumatic fever and other post-streptococcal sequelae.

Action Required

- Order SORO for all ASO testing.
