# **Key Message**

- When entering text into the Specimen Description and Comments fields, do not use 'All Caps'.
- When the information is entered using 'All Caps', lab cannot change this to regular text to remove the All Caps.
- Feedback has been received from clinicians and pathologists that use of All Caps in non-diagnosis fields poses a potential safety risk to patients and must be discontinued.

# **Background**

- Text entered in All Caps into the Specimen Description and Comments fields in EPIC cannot be changed by lab. This text is pulled to the patient final report.
- The eye is drawn to the All Caps in the Specimen Description instead of to the Final Diagnosis field, increasing the risk of missing or misinterpreting diagnostic information.

## How this will impact you

Refrain from using All Caps when entering text.

## **Action Required**

- Ensure the CAPS key is off when entering orders and collection information for Surgical Pathology and Cytology tests.
- Ensure staff are trained not to use All Caps while entering text.
