RE:	South Zone IVIG Screening Update

Key Message

Starting June 6, 2022 South Zone Transfusion Medicine (TM) will screen all IVIG requests following the
established standardized provincial procedure. This procedure is based on the recommendations from the
Prairie Collobrative Criteria for the Clinical Use of Immune Globulin. Following these recommendations will
provide the minimal effective dose of IVIG while optimizing the treatment for each individual.

Background

South Zone is working to align with provincial processes prior to the Connect Care Launch 7.

How this will impact you

- South Zone TM will screen product requests for patients with booked IVIG appointments via an established
 process at the transfusion medicine site. During this review if an IVIG request form is missing, expired or
 does not contain all of the required elements, TM will contact the transfusing area to ensure the request form
 is completed with all of the prerequisite information.
- Patients require the request form to be completed in order to initiate IVIG therapy. To avoid delays and
 potential rescheduling of appointments please ensure all request forms are complete as determined by TM.
- In urgent situations (ITP with bleeding, Guillain Barre Syndrome for example) a patient will not be denied product for transfusion.
- Once IVIG request forms are completed please forward to the appropriate Transfusion Medicine Laboratory:
