## PLEASE POST OR DISTRIBUTE AS WIDELY AS APPROPRIATE

### Key Message:

- Alberta Precision Laboratories released three new requisitions on February 14, 2020.
  - Acute care providers, nursing units and hospital clinics who also may use paper requisitions may not have received this communication.
- These new requisitions replace a number of legacy requisitions or replace content that was included on Central, North and South Zone "Laboratory Requisitions". See page 2 for details.
- While the primary users are community lab orders, these forms can and are also used in acute care without online order entry or when order entry is unavailable.
- The new requisitions have specific fields for Connect Care provider and submitter information. A requisition completion guide can be found below that outlines these fields. See page 3 for details.

#### Why this is important:

- Acute care sites may be on Connect Care or legacy systems. Some acute care/hospital clinic locations routinely use paper requisitions, while others only use paper requisitions when electronic systems are in downtime.
- During Connect Care implementation there will be some laboratories who are on Connect Care and others that are still using legacy systems; samples may be transported to and tested in <u>any laboratory</u> in the province. Ensuring all lab requisitions have both Connect Care and legacy healthcare ID's and complete name and address information are the most important actions you can take to enable successful laboratory report delivery during transition.

#### **Action Required:**

- For acute care sites and hospital clinics utilizing paper requisition routinely or during a system downtime, order new requisitions using your existing process.
- Use **only** new versions of requisitions where available and include all provider/submitter/legacy ID's on requisitions.
