Re: Transition of Testing for Herpes simplex Virus and Varicella zoster Virus from CLS to ProvLab

Key Messages:

• <u>Effective December 01, 2013</u>, testing for Herpes simplex virus (HSV) and Varicella zoster virus (VZV) currently performed at Calgary Laboratory Services (CLS) will be transferred to ProvLab.

- The methodology will change from the CLS Direct Fluorescent Antibody (DFA) methodology to the Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) methodology used at ProvLab.
- PCR testing is more sensitive than DFA testing. Samples that test positive for Herpes simplex will be subtyped to determine if they are type 1 or type 2.

Action Required:

Prior to December 01, 2013

- Order an appropriate supply of *Universal Transport Medium (UTM)*, swabs and ProvLab Virology requisitions from ProvLab using the <u>Specimen Collection Kits/Requisition Order Form</u>. The order form is found on page 12 of the ProvLab Guide to Services at: www.provlab.ab.ca/guide-to-services.pdf or by calling ProvLab Stores at: 403-944-1240.
- Return all unused Herpes slide collection kits to CLS.

After December 01, 2013

- Refer to the "Sample Type and Collection Guidelines for Herpes simplex Virus (HSV) and Varicella zoster Virus (VZV) Testing" posted on the ProvLab website at: www.provlab.ab.ca/education.htm.
- Complete one ProvLab Virology requisition for each patient requiring testing.
 - > Check off Varicella zoster or Herpes simplex for detection of virus.
 - Clearly indicate the <u>specimen sites</u> on BOTH the requisition and sample containers, if multiple sites are being tested.
- Swab the lesion(s) and place swab in Universal Transport Medium container.

There will be a two month transition period ending <u>January 31, 2014</u>. Samples received <u>after</u> this date in kits other than in UTM will NOT be tested. Scrapings of the lesions sent on the dual well herpes slide provided in the Herpes collection kit will no longer be acceptable.

Testing and Reporting:

- Testing will be performed at ProvLab three times a week.
- Results will be available in Alberta Netcare and delivered through ProvLab's Cerner Millennium[®] LIS method.
