- Re: Reduced post-end-of-treatment (EOT) followup testing in hepatitis C (HCV)-infected patients

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Key Messages:

- *Effective 10 October 2013*, only one HCV RNA (HCV VL) test will be routinely performed for HCV-infected patients who have completed therapy.
- Published studies and local practice-based experience indicate that a single HCV RNA test within the 12-24 weeks after completion of therapy gives a reliable confirmation of sustained virological response (SVR) at these time points in most patients.
- Therefore, unless there are special requests from individual physicians for specific patients, only one follow up HCV RNA test will be routinely performed for HCV-infected patients who have satisfactorily completed their designated course of treatment.

Why this is important:

- In most patients, there is little or no evidence or practice-based experience to show that follow up testing for HCV RNA beyond 24 weeks post-EOT offers any additional benefit with regard to confirming an SVR status.
- Additional and unnecessary HCV RNA testing beyond the 12-24 post-EOT time point is costly and does not contribute further to patient management
