Re: Testing of Extragenital Specimens for *Chlamydia trachomatis* 

# PLEASE POST OR DISTRIBUTE AS WIDELY AS APPROPRIATE

## **Key Messages:**

• On March 28, 2014 ProvLab discontinued Chlamydia cultures.

 Culture was replaced with the more sensitive Aptima Combo 2® Nucleic Acid Amplification Test (NAAT) which requires specimens to be collected and submitted in the Gen-Probe Aptima® Specimen Collection Kits.

## Why this is important:

- Requests for *Chlamydia* cultures collected on swabs and submitted in UTM or Amies transport media cannot be processed.
- Recollection using the Gen-Probe Aptima® Specimen Collection Kits is required for these specimens to be processed by NAAT.

### **Action Required:**

- Specimens from eyes and other extragenital sites should be collected using the Gen-Probe Aptima® unisex swabs.
- Consult the ProvLab Guide to Services for information on the appropriate specimen collection kits.
- Note: Specimen kits are only validated for use at their specified sites; they are not interchangeable.

NAAT testing on extragenital specimens is not Health Canada or FDA approved, and has not been validated at ProvLab. Results should be interpreted with caution.
