Re: Submitting Campylobacter Isolates to ProvLab

# PLEASE POST OR DISTRIBUTE AS WIDELY AS APPROPRIATE

## **Key Message:**

Microbiology laboratories are not required to <u>routinely</u> submit *Campylobacter* isolates to ProvLab for "study" or "surveillance\*\*" purposes.

# Why this is important:

Some microbiology laboratories routinely submit *Campylobacter* isolates to ProvLab labeled "study" or "surveillance". ProvLab does not require routine submission of *Campylobacter* isolates for these purposes.

## **Action Required:**

- Effective immediately microbiology laboratories should discontinue submitting *Campylobacter* isolates to ProvLab for "study" or "surveillance" purposes.
- Laboratories should continue to submit *Campylobacter* isolates to ProvLab as operationally required for identification or confirmation of identification.

\*\* **Note:** In 2016, ProvLab in collaboration with Alberta Health and AHS and FoodNet Canada (Public Health Agency of Canada) will be requiring submission of *Campylobacter jejuni/coli* isolates associated with cases arising in the Alberta FoodNet sentinel surveillance sites. A future notice will be communicated with those laboratories to be involved in this surveillance program.
