Re: Microalbumin Testing of Visibly Bloody Urine Specimens

PLEASE POST OR DISTRIBUTE AS WIDELY AS APPROPRIATE

Key Messages:

• Effective immediately, the Chemistry department at Chinook Regional Hospital Laboratory will no longer process visibly bloody urine specimens for Microalbumin analysis.

Why this is important:

- Microalbumin is ordered to detect small amounts of albumin (protein) in urine. The presence
 of blood elevates the protein and interferes with the interpretation of the result.
- The vendor does not recommend analyzing bloody specimens for Microalbumin.

Action Required:

- Do not submit visibly bloody urine specimens for Microalbumin analysis.
- If visibly bloody urine specimens arrive in Chemistry for Microalbumin analysis, they will be rejected as per the Acceptance of Laboratory Samples and Test Requests policy.
