Key Messages:

Chinook Regional Hospital Laboratory has altered its Urine Drug Screen methodology as of April 25th, 2013.

- The new method aligns across the Zone and offers an enhanced reporting profile.
- There is no change in ordering process.

Why this is important:

• The new method offers a wider range of reportable elements, outlined within Table 1.1, and illustrated in bold type.
