Re: Body Fluid Cell Count Reporting

PLEASE POST OR DISTRIBUTE AS WIDELY AS APPROPRIATE

Key Messages:

Effective immediately, the reporting units for cell counts on body fluids (peritoneal, pericardial, pleural and synovial) have changed. Body fluid cell counts are now being reported in units of x10⁶/L.

Body fluid cell counts were previously reported in units of $x10^9/L$. Body fluid cell counts will now being reported in units of $x10^6/L$ which is a conversion factor of 1000. For example, a body fluid White Blood Cell count previously reported as $0.550 \times 10^9/L$ is equivalent to $550 \times 10^6/L$ in the new reporting units. The same units/conversion factor applied to body fluid Red Blood Cell counts.

Why this is important:

The change in reporting was made to ensure that patient results are consistent with reference literature as well as with reporting of similar testing in other AHS sites in the province.
