Re: Change in PTT Heparin Therapeutic Range Level Affecting Patient Care Orders

PLEASE POST OR DISTRIBUTE AS WIDELY AS APPROPRIATE

Key Messages:

Due to a change in PTT reagent, the PTT heparin therapeutic range will be changed effective **0001hours**, **on Wednesday**, **October 10**, **2012**. After this time, for all applicable sets of Patient Care Orders, a new label **dated October 2012** is to be attached in the "PTT results in seconds" section. The new PTT heparin therapeutic range for monitoring patients on full dose IV heparin therapy at all Edmonton Zone sites will be 75-105 seconds. The old labels, **dated May 2011**, should be destroyed effective 0001hours, October 10, 2012. Please use the following table to determine which labels to affix to their respective Patient Care Orders:

MIS (Misericordia) GNH (Grey Nuns)	Not Applicable – Covenant sites have a separate set of forms that do not employ labels. These sites will undergo the same PTT reagent and heparin therapeutic range change on the same date but will update their Patient Care Orders through a separate process.		



Note: It is possible that over time forms have made their way across sites in the Edmonton zone. What is most <u>critical</u> is that the correct form is paired with the correct label and that the labels used are changed over on the correct date.

Why this is important:

On *October 10, 2012 at 0001hours*, all patients receiving heparin as per the Patient Care Orders will require a new Patient Care Orders form *with the new label affixed* and the heparin infusion rate adjusted depending on the PTT result of blood drawn on or after October 10, 2012.

Action Required:

An order for printing the new labels has been placed with Data Group. The new labels may be ordered
effective September 24, 2012. I encourage you to order them as soon as possible, prior to the change, through
the usual process with Data Group.
