Re: Return and Reuse of Blood Delivery Bags

## PLEASE POST OR DISTRIBUTE AS WIDELY AS APPROPRIATE

Key Messages: Please follow these procedures for handling and return of blood delivery bags

- Dispose of bags that are visibly soiled, damaged or significantly worn
- Ensure good hand hygiene practices when handling bags
- Empty bags at the nursing station, do not take them into patient rooms or place in approved blood storage refrigerators
- Create a location for collection of the bags and return them to the laboratory regularly (daily or at least weekly for low use areas)
- Do not call portering just to return the empty bags, they can be returned when sending specimens to the lab with porters or lab collectors, via pneumatic tube or interoffice mail.

Importance/Impact: Following these procedures will eliminate any negative impact on portering workload and balance our desire for environmental and fiscal responsibility with patient safety concerns.

Background / Action Required: The Infection Prevention and Control and Distribution departments were consulted to develop these processes.
