Re: Hepatitis C Virus Genotyping Testing Change

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Key Message:

Effective October 11, 2011, ProvLab will no longer report Hepatitis C Virus (HCV) typing down to the subtype level; only the genotype will be reported.

Why this is Important:

- ProvLab currently reports both HCV genotype and subtype results.
- Current treatment protocols for HCV are determined on <u>genotype</u> results and not on *subtype* results so this change has NO adverse clinical impact.
- HCV subtyping may result in reporting delays due to either mixed subtype infection and/or inherent limitations with the assay. Delayed HCV genotype reporting can have an adverse clinical impact.
- This initiative was endorsed by the Provincial Hepatitis Stakeholders Committee.

Action Required:

Collection and Transport of Specimens: No change

If a subtype result is required for clinical care: the clinician can contact the laboratory to arrange for such testing.
