

## **Packaging Transport Container at Clinics**

**Exempt Human Specimens** 

## **Before Packaging:**

- 1. Label specimen container with:
  - a) Full first and last name.
  - b) Personal Health Insurance Number or Unique Lifetime Identifier or Government Issued Identification number.
  - c) Date and time of collection.
  - d) Specimen type and/or body site (for Microbiology, Cytology and Histopathology specimens only).
- 2. Label slides with the patient's **full** first and last name.
- 3. Complete manual requisitions with the following:
  - a) Full first and last name.
  - b) Personal Health Insurance Number (If Out of Province include the expiry date if available) or Unique Lifetime Identifier or Government Issued Identification number.
  - c) Date and time of collection.
  - d) Specimen type and/or body site (for Microbiology, Cytology and Histopathology specimens only).
  - e) Date of birth and gender.
  - f) Patients phone number.
  - g) Full first and last name of requestor along with the report location/address of requestor.
  - h) Full first and last name of "copy to" recipient along with the location/address of "copy to" recipient.
  - i) Test(s)/procedure ordered.

## **Packaging Instructions:**

- 1. Collect specimen, making sure all lids are on tight.
- 2. Place specimen in a biohazard bag. Fold requisition and place in biohazard pouch.
- 3. Place all biohazard bags in a secondary plastic bag with sufficient quantity of dri-mops to absorb any possible leakage of a liquid substance that could occur during transport.



- 4. Also place a couple of dri mops in the bottom of the transport container.
- 5. Attach a cable tie to transport box to ensure the security of the contents during transportation.
- 5. Place transport container in designated pick-up area.

## **Procedure Note:**

1. One dri-mop will absorb approximately 100ml.
