Re: Modification of Viral Testing on Cerebrospinal Fluid (CSF) Samples

PLEASE POST OR DISTRIBUTE AS WIDELY AS APPROPRIATE

Key Messages:

<u>Effective March 15, 2011</u>, the current Herpes simplex virus (HSV) PCR assay used at ProvLab will be replaced by a multiplex assay that will test simultaneously for HSV-1, HSV-2 and Varicella zoster virus (VZV). All cerebrospinal fluid (CSF) samples received at ProvLab with a request for "viral PCR", "viral culture", "viral studies" or a diagnosis of encephalitis or aseptic meningitis will be tested by default for:

- ➤ Herpes simplex virus (HSV-1 and 2) / Varicella zoster virus (VZV)
- Enteroviruses
- West Nile virus (WNV) (June 1 to October 30)

Please note that requests for molecular detection of other viruses in CSF samples require a consultation with the Virologist on Call (VOC) at ProvLab prior to submission.
